Provincial Achievement Test Results Report for 2018-2019 November 1, 2019

OUR STUDENTS POSSESS THE CONFIDENCE, RESILIENCE, INSIGHT AND SKILLS REQUIRED TO THRIVE IN, AND POSITIVELY IMPACT, THE WORLD.

This report summarizes the results achieved by Blueberry School's grade six and grade nine students for the June 2019 Provincial Achievement Test period.

Assessment for Learning

School administration and staff carefully analyze the results of the June 2019 Provincial Achievement Tests to guide classroom instruction moving forward.

With respect to Provincial Achievement Tests:

The School surpassed the Province of Alberta's results on:

- 8 of 8 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Acceptable Standard; and
- 5 of 8 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Standard of Excellence.

The School surpassed Parkland School Division's results on:

- 8 of 8 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Acceptable Standard; and
- 8 of 8 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Standard of Excellence.

The School results surpassed last year's results on:

- 4 of 8 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Acceptable Standard, and
- 6 of 8 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Standard of Excellence.

The Chart on the next page provides detailed areas of growth and results for our school in comparison to the provincial and school division results.

Notable Results:

- Blueberry students scored higher than the province at the Standard of Excellence on English Language Arts 9, Science 9, Social 9, Math 6 and Social 6.
- Our students scored above the provincial average on the Grade 9 and Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests in the four subject areas at the Acceptable Standard (English Language Arts, Math, Social and Science).
- Blueberry's Grade 9 students scored 28.2% higher than the provincial average on the Provincial Achievement Test in Mathematics 9 at the Acceptable Standard.
- Our students scored above the provincial average on the Grade 9 Provincial Achievement Tests in the four subject areas at the Acceptable Standard (English Language Arts 9, Math 9, Social 9, Science 9).

• Blueberry students exceeded Parkland School Division students in all Grade 9 and Grade 6 Provincial Achievement Tests at the Standard of Excellence.

Areas for Growth:

- Blueberry School will explore strategies that will increase the percentage of students scoring at the Standard of Excellence in English Language Arts 6.
- Blueberry School will explore strategies to increase the percentage of students scoring at the Acceptable Standard in Science 6.
