Important Registration Dates

- May-June 2024 Confirmation of busing requests. (Fees will be applied to accounts once the student has been assigned to a bus).
- Thursday, June 20, 2024 Deadline to make payment arrangements for bus passes
- Beginning of July Bus passes and route numbers will start to be mailed to parents/guardians.

During the months of May and June, students in grades 6 and 9 will be writing Provincial Achievement exams in Mathematics, Language Arts, Science and Social. RECENT HIGHLIGHTS

Blueberry School Council welcomed Parkland School Division Associate Superintendent Mr. Johnston to our council meeting this month. Mr. Johnson began by explaining that in order to understand the roots of childhood behavior we first have to contextualize childhood development. He spent time describing development through early childhood, middle childhood, early adolescence and late adolescence. Using the analogy of an elephant and its rider, he shared how the role of the amygdala and the prefrontal cortex work together to regulate emotion and understand social behavior. Emotional dysregulation occurs when a rider (prefrontal cortex) has fallen off of its elephant (amygdala). This understanding was then used to explain social behavior and peer relationships. The discussion then led to a conversation pertaining to conflict, mean behavior and targeted and repeated mean behavior.

Tips for Parenting Included:

- Understanding that children are not mini adults. As adults we cannot go back and remember thinking like a child and a child has not developed the ability to think like an adult.
- 2) Adults are called to interact with children in a way that keeps their rider on their own elephant. Exposing a child to a rogue adult elephant (rider has fallen off) does not allow for communication, understanding and growth on the part of the child.
- Elephants do not communicate. Riders do. Regulate a child (and the adult) before attempting to communicate.
- Support by saying "Do This" as opposed to "Don't Do This."
- Consequences need to teach - not punish. Do not teach with an elephant. Teach with a rider.
